INIS SENIOR RESEARCH FELLOWS PROF. ALEKSANDRA GASZTOLD AND PROF. JOWANKA JAKUBEK-LALIK AT WARSAW SECURITY FORUM – CONCLUSIONS AND ANALYSIS AFTER MORE THAN 200 DAYS OF RUSSIAN AGGRESSION AGAINST UKRAINE



The Warsaw Security Forum is one of the leading European security conferences devoted to transatlantic cooperation and focused on elaborating shared responses to common challenges, with an emphasis on the security of Central and Eastern Europe. This year's exchange of ideas between more than 150 leading experts, politicians, soldiers and activists took place in the context of Russia's aggression against Ukraine and on the basis of the, already gained, Ukrainian lessons drawn from this conflict.

Organised since 2014, the Warsaw Security Forum gathers annually over 1500 highest representatives of governments, international organizations, industry, think tanks and civil society coming from over 90 countries.

The two days programme was packed with on-stage high-level panel discussions, Chatham House rules-based round tables and dozens of bilateral meetings mixed with industry presentations and cultural program of the Guest Country – all designed to



find answers to the most pressing current political and military issues.

During the Forum, the Knight of Freedom award was given to the People of Ukraine and was accepted by the First Lady of Ukraine, Olena Zelenska. Another powerful speech was delivered by the leader of Belarusian democratic opposition, Sviatlana Tsikhanouskaya.

Another important feature of the WSF was working breakfast and other formats organized by Women in International Security Poland, attesting to the importance of gender balance and equality in the international security dialogue.
