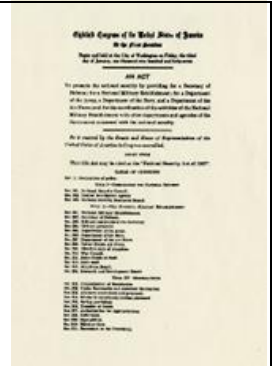

75th Anniversary of the National Security Act of 1947 Free-Access Articles



On July 26, 1947, President Harry Truman signed the National Security Act of 1947 (NSA-47). This landmark legislation after World War II marked the establishment of what we now consider the United States Intelligence Community. Specifically, NSA-47 established the Central Intelligence Agency, out of the Office of Strategic Services, merged the War Department and Navy Department into the Department of Defense under the Secretary of Defense, and created the Department of the Air Force. Since then it has seen some revision after the attacks on U.S. soil on September 11, 2001.
